

WHO CAN ACCESS THIS SERVICE?

WBEAC is available to people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness, including those experiencing domestic violence and young people over 16 years of age. Children under the age of 16 years must be in the company of an adult.

We do not discriminate, we value diversity and the house is physically accessible to all.

WE'RE ALL ABOUT YOU

HOW WE CAN SUPPORT YOU

The Centre offers short-term crisis accommodation in a safe environment.

Families, couples and single people, including any accompanying children are provided with, or assisted to access, accommodation and other appropriate support. They are provided with direct support or are assisted to access other services to address issues contributing to their homelessness.

Staff are available from 9am to 5pm Monday to Friday to assist with:

- Advocacy;
- Support planning;
- · Referral; and
- Linkage services.

Staff will work with you to identify your goals and to help you take the next steps forward in terms of securing a safe place to live.

Outreach support to prevent homelessness is also offered. This can be provided for people who are not staying at the Centre.

WHAT IS EXPECTED OF YOU?

WBEAC is only intended as a short-term solution. It is crucial that you work with staff to consider all available options.

It is expected that you will take the lead in making enquiries regarding housing availability, however, staff will assist as required.

It is expected that clients will adhere to the Rights and Responsibilities set out in the Welcome Pack provided on arrival. Should there be any behaviour that threatens the health and safety of clients and staff, your stay at WBEAC will be reviewed and you may be asked to leave the house.

LEAVING WBEAC

Staff will work with you on an exit plan to ensure you have a safe place to live upon leaving.
